First Alaskan's Summer 2007 Paid Internships Throughout Alaska:

The First Alaskan's Institute has 30 paid internship positions throughout

Alaska, available for the summer 2007 in the following areas:

Education, Health, Oil and Gas Industry, Organizational Management, Public Policy, Economic Development, Rural Development, Research, Human Resources.

Requirements: Applicants must be: Alaska Native, college juniors, seniors or graduate level students.

The internship lasts 10 weeks, from early June to mid August (schedules can be adjusted based on the student's academic schedules). Applicants who intend to return to rural Alaska upon completion of education will be given priority for selection into the program.

Deadline for applications: February 28, 2007.

Meghan Woodman selected as All-Star

BELLINGHAM, Wash. - Western Washington University defender [Meghan Woodman](#) was the only freshman named to the first team of the 2006 Daktronics Far West Region Women's Soccer All-Star selections. Woodman, a redshirt freshman from Redmond, had a team-best eight assists; and Weber, a senior from Yakima (Eisenhower High School graduate), led the squad in goals with nine and points with 19. They both played key roles on a defense that allowed just 1.17 goals per game and registered eight shutouts. Both Weber and Woodman were first-team all-GNAC picks, with Weber being a unanimous selection. Western, which finished 14-5-1 and placed second in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference at 7-2-1, made the school's first NCAA Division II Far West Regional appearance, losing 4-0 in the semifinals to eventual champion UC San Diego. The 14 wins were the second highest in school history and the most since 1984. It was their first post-season appearance since 1996. Meghan's family is from Redmond, Washington and her mother is shareholder, Mary Eufemio. Meghan is studying to become an Occupational Therapist.
